Graduation Requirements and Diploma Pathways Policy

Policy Number: AISL-ACA-009

Effective: August 2026

Review: Every Two Years

Purpose

This policy establishes graduation requirements and diploma pathways for students at AISL.

Graduation Pathways

AISL offers two graduation pathways: (1) American High School Diploma and (2) International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP). Students may complete either pathway or satisfy the requirements for both qualifications simultaneously.

American High School Diploma

Students complete AISL graduation requirements including English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, World Languages, Physical Education and Health, Fine Arts, Technology, electives, community service, satisfactory GPA, attendance, conduct and financial obligations.

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

Students complete six IB subjects, Theory of Knowledge, the Extended Essay, Creativity Activity Service, and all required internal and external assessments according to IB regulations.

Earning Both Diplomas

Students may complete both AISL graduation requirements and the IB Diploma requirements. Where appropriate, IB coursework also fulfills corresponding AISL graduation requirements.

University Pathway Guidance

The American Diploma supports admission to universities in the United States, Canada, Africa and many institutions worldwide. The IB Diploma is recognized by universities throughout Europe, the UK, North America, Asia, Africa and Australia. Students earning both qualifications maximize flexibility.

AISL University Counseling Programme

Beginning in Grade 9, students receive university counseling, four-year planning, scholarship guidance, career exploration, application support, essay coaching, interview preparation and

university fair participation.

University Readiness Expectations

Graduates complete a résumé, personal statement, digital portfolio, community service record and post-secondary transition plan.

Recognition of International Admissions Requirements

Students and families work closely with the University Counselor to ensure course selections align with university entrance requirements.
